#### BACKGROUND

- Only 10-20% people in Nepal have access to basic mental health care (1)
- Dang district of Nepal with population >600,000 had no formal mental heath services until Health Foundation Nepal Discuss the outcomes of the initiatives so far (HFN), a non-profit organization in the United States and Nepal, started the mental health services in 2018 (2)

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- Describe the process of the mental health projects of HFN

#### Since 2018: Addressing stigma and promoting evidence based practices

- >3-4 community mental health awareness events per month
- > Increasing beneficiaries in the community
- >4 major studies conducted and another one is ongoing


#### Since 2019: Integration of mental health care in the primary healthcare centers

- > Already integrated in 5 health centers as of 2020
- > Aim to integrate in 20 more health centers by 2021
- Task shifting by providing basic psychiatric training to the local primary care providers and the community mental health workers

#### Since 2019: Introduction of a community based maternal mental health program, first of its kind in the country

- > Community based maternal mental health program
- > Supervision and monitoring from volunteer psychiatrists and psychologists from Kathmandu and the USA
- >Individual and group counseling in the community
- >Medication management and referral to higher centers as needed

## Regional center for the integrated mental health is under construction

- All the services are provided free of cost to the community people
- •: Volunteering of HFN leaders, strong support from local community, and financial support from the people who love Nepal



#### Conclusion:

- ❖ It is possible to translate mental health ideas into action even in the resource limited communities in the world including that in Nepal
- Challenges of financial sustainability needs to be addressed

## Since 2020: Psychiatric care and rehabilitation center, first of its kind in the country

- ☐ Shelter, general medical care and psychiatric services led by a general physician, and volunteer consultants from Kathmandu and the USA
- ☐ Recovery and rehabilitation services utilizing available local resources
- ☐ 10 people with SMI receiving the ongoing care, and the demand is increasing
